Welcome to the April/May edition of the Lostwithiel Area u3a Newsletter. Now the clocks have changed and we have spring forward into British Summer Time here's hoping for some sunnier and warmer days ahead! In this issue we have news of a vacancy on the committee and a report on our last Open Meeting plus updates from our groups including a new group contact/leader for the Garden Visits group, the Theatre Group in the audience for *Hell's Bells* at the Lostwithiel Community Centre and u3Art holding a bric-a-brac sale for the LCC.

Open Meeting Monday March 4th 2024

At our Open Meeting on 4th March in the Church Rooms, our guest speaker was **Sue Newton**, County Organiser for the **National Garden Scheme** who gave a very informative and well received talk about the National Open Garden Scheme. Sue's presentation - **Beyond the Garden Gate** - told us about the history of the scheme and with a very impressive and colourful slideshow, took us on a tour of some of the gardens in Cornwall open this year as part of the scheme, including many smaller private gardens open by arrangement together with Sue's own delightful garden in St Blazey.

It all began in 1859 in Liverpool, with William Rathbone, a wealthy philanthropist, who funded nursing skills for the community of Liverpool which was experiencing enormous poverty at the time. With advice from a certain Florence Nightingale about how to expand nursing services for the community, a district nursing service was born. Funding sources were sought to continue the expansion of community nursing services and 1927 saw the introduction of a countrywide scheme to open large private gardens for the public to enjoy, with an admission fee on entry to raise much needed cash. Our own Lanhydrock House was one of the four Cornish gardens involved and this began the National Garden Scheme. £19 million has been raised since those early days, with 1984 seeing the first donation to Macmillan nurses. For 2024 there is a stunning selection of over 60 gardens for visitors to enjoy in Cornwall, including some new gardens, and the NGS is always looking for more garden owners kindly agreeing to open their gardens as part of the scheme. With 3,500 gardens, 500 volunteers, and generations of bakers and tea makers, as Sue summarised at the end of her talk - essentially it's about raising money and cake! Theatre

Highlights from the last couple of months include: *Hell's Bells* performed to a full house by the Miracle Theatre at the Lostwithiel Community Centre The group had 18 members attending, an excellent turnout on a very wet Saturday night. The play and the acting was brilliant - all the more so with a cast of just three actors playing all the various characters. At the end of the performance the cast came out to take 3 curtain calls to well-earned applause.

Jam Jazz in the refurbished Old Library at Bodmin.was another most enjoyable evening of jazz and several of us went to see a streamed performance of *Vanya* at the Merlin cinema in Bodmin, a one man "tour de force" by the actor Andrew Scott who played all the main characters just using voice changes and mannerisms (*last week Scott was announced as best actor by the Critics' Circle theatre awards for this role - Ed.*). We also managed to fit in the *Canterbury Tales* at Mount premises, Warleggan where David Mynne's astonishing rendering of a selection of Chaucer's tales was engaging, clever, uproariously funny - and also true to the original text.

We are a very lively, active and friendly Group meeting every 3rd Thursday morning of the month when members choose and help organise trips. We go to live and live-streamed theatre, music and dance in and around Cornwall and beyond. We use public transport where possible. u3Art

In January we compiled a new list of "themes" to work to for those who wish to. The first theme was to produce "portraits" of trees in charcoal and pencil, concentrating on tonal values and form rather than colour, allowing us to concentrate on the varying shapes of different types of trees.

We then moved on to "unusual skies/weather" in any medium. Members brought in their own photographs or found pictures in the group's art books. The aim was to depict different weathers by making the sky the focal point of the painting. Our third theme was "sponge painting" using natural sponges instead of brushes and either watercolour paint, acrylic paint or inks. We discovered that using a sponge can produce remarkable textures easily, and is excellent for painting foliage, clouds, rocks, breaking waves, walls, buildings, etc, etc. Please see our webpage here for more examples of our work
